The clubhouse at PLCC carries a full line of equipment, a banquet room available for private rental, a full kitchen, grill and a bar area serving snacks and drinks. Many golfers finish their round relaxing with their friends on the large outdoor patio, taking in the green views from the hilltop. Throughout the summer months, PLCC is busy with ladies & men's leagues, couples two-balls, cocktail parties, tournaments and private events.

PLCC is fortunate to have longtime greens keeper Daryl Clingerman to maintain the fairways, greens and keep the course in great shape. Several other staff work to manage the clubhouse and mow those beautifully long fairways. Golfers have enjoyed lush, watered fairways since 1989.
